PPRAG 1420 Pharmacy Based Immunization Delivery (2qhrs)

Max: 75

Instructor: Dr. Dawn Gerber

Description: Pharmacy-Based Immunization Delivery is an innovative and interactive training program that teaches pharmacists & student pharmacists the skills necessary to become a primary source for vaccine information and administration. The program teaches the basics of immunology and focuses on practice implementation and legal/regulatory issues. Approximately 10 hours of required pre-class work. PPRAG 1420 will be offered on **Saturday, September 13 (8:00 am – 5:00 pm)**.

Prerequisite: **PS-2 status**; MICRG 1553 Immunology; and blood-borne pathogen training.

PPRAG 1421 Dental Health and the Pharmacist (1.5qhrs)

Max: None

Instructor: Tom McDaniel, DMD

Description: This course provides the pharmacy student with a brief overview of dentistry and its relation to health care. Questions that patients often ask pharmacists regarding oral lesions, injuries to the oral cavity, and efficacy of OTC and prescription remedies will be discussed. The relationship between oral and systemic health and the effects of medications and nutrition on the oral cavity will be explored. Included is information about the various dental specialties to help the pharmacist refer their patients to the appropriate specialist and a segment examining the unique challenges encountered in the geriatric population. An examination of compounding in dentistry and prescribing of opioids for dental conditions will finish off the course.

PPRAG 1438 Managed Care (1.5qhrs)

Max: 50

Instructor: John Pacey, BS Pharm, RPh

Description: The purpose of this course is to provide an overview of managed care pharmacy and how it impacts the U.S. healthcare system. The course will prepare students to understand and learn about professional practice opportunities in managed care pharmacy by exploring health care reform, managed health care delivery models, prescription benefit design, pharmacy networks, utilization management tools, P&T Committees, pharmacy data management, pharmacy benefit managers, specialty pharmacy and pharmaceutical manufacturers. In addition, the course will focus on how business principles are integrated into the managed care pharmacy department, and address how clinical pharmacy, quality improvement, medication therapy management/disease management programs are coordinated within the managed care pharmacy environment.

PSCIG 1305 Pharmacy: Its History and Heroes (2.0qhrs)

Max: None

Instructor: Dr. Karen Nagel-Edwards

Description: This course begins with a general overview of pharmacy throughout history, with special emphasis placed on United States pharmacy and pharmacy associations. The course ends with lectures focused on the history of the opioid epidemic, and history of pandemics.

Prerequisite: **PS-2 status**

PSCIG 1323 Use and Abuse of Drugs (1.5qhrs)

Max: None

Instructor: Dr. Oliver Grundmann

Description: This elective course provides an in-depth review of neuropharmacology of substances of abuse including stimulants, depressants and inhalants, ethanol, opioids, hallucinogens, marijuana, anabolic steroids and other performance enhancing drugs. In addition, an overview of drug use, drug use as a social problem, drug products and their regulations, the nervous system, the mechanism of action of drugs, preventing substance abuse and substance abuse and dependence will also be covered.

PSCIG 1364 Introduction to Teaching & Learning (3.0qhrs)

Max: 8

Instructor: Dr. Melanie Jordan

Description: This course will introduce students to concepts in teaching and learning through discussion and hands-on teaching experiences. Students will learn to teach in a laboratory setting in a small group environment. Weekly self-reflection activities will help students focus on their strengths, weaknesses, and development as an educator over the course of the quarter.

Prerequisite: **PSCIG 1541L and PSCIG 1542**

IPECG 1404C Leadership in Healthcare Teams (1.5qhrs)

Max: Variable

Instructors: Dr. Cara Copeland (CDMA), Dr. Shawn Tennant

Description: This interprofessional, seven-week on-line elective is designed for students, while working on authentic healthcare teams, to develop the skills needed for leadership in their area(s) of practice. The skills learned will range from taking ownership of patient issues to developing solid interpersonal professional relationships. The course instruction is through on-line educational modules, reinforcing that knowledge through authentic-team case study discussions and self-reflection writings.

Prerequisite: Enrollment is limited to PS-2 students.

PPRAG 1301 (1.5qhrs) or PPRAG 1302 (3qhrs): Special Project/Research

PSCIG 1301 (1.5qhrs) or PSCIG 1302 (3qhrs): Special Project/Research

Instructor: Faculty Sponsor

Description: Special Projects provide an opportunity for students to work with individual faculty mentors on research projects of variable kinds. All Special Projects require approval from the Department Chair and Dean's Office. A Special Project Request Form must be completed and requires signature approval of the appropriate Department Chair and the Dean's Office.
